

LOCKPORT AMONG SAFEST CITIES IN AMERICA -2015

NEIGHBORHOODSCOUT RANKING IS ABOUT SAFETY FROM ALL CRIMES

NeighborhoodScout ranked the City of Lockport in the top 100 Safest Cities in America. In the report, NeighborhoodScout compares the safety of cities (populations more than 25,000) across the country by factoring in population and providing a rate for individual types of crimes per 1,000 residents. The ranking is about safety from all crimes - cities are ranked by overall crime rate, including both violent crimes and property crimes.

NeighborhoodScout ranked Lockport as the 71st safest city. According to comparative data, becoming a victim of a violent crime in Lockport is 1 in 1,001 and becoming a victim of a property crime is 1 in 95. The national median is 3.8 per 1,000 and 27.3 per 1,000 respectively.

Other communities that made the top 100 include Elmhurst, Glen Ellyn, Wheaton, Plainfield, Mount Prospect, Highland Park, Buffalo Grove, and Arlington Heights. To see the full story and listings go online to www.neighborhoodscout.com/neighborhoods/crime-rates/top100safest/

WINTER IS OVER

Now that the long, snowy winter is over, you will see our Public Works crews throughout town working on the following this spring / summer.

- Hydrant Flushing – starts April 1st and will run through mid-June
- Street Sweeping – the entire city is swept one time in the spring and one time in the fall
- Mosquito Spraying – we only spray when necessary and when the weather conditions allow the mist to be effective
- Dirt & Seed Restoration

Aside from these programs, Public Works will also be busy with routine maintenance throughout the city, which includes but is not limited to, grass cutting, patching pot holes, etc.

Currently, the City has a contract with Waste Management for branch pickup. Branches that are cut and bound according to the instructions listed here will be picked up weekly by Waste Management.

Branch bundles must:

- Be no more than 4 feet in length
- Be no more than 5 inches in diameter
- Weigh no more than 50 pounds
- Be securely tied w/string or twine

**Unbundled branches will NOT be accepted by
Waste Management.**

The Mayor and Council recognize the difficulty in meeting these guidelines when larger jobs are at hand. Therefore, the City's chipper will make one pass through the City two times per year. One pass through the City can take up to 2 weeks. You must have your unbundled branches laid cut end out at the edge of your yard on the first day of the program.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Welcome to spring! Please keep in mind that permits are required for most exterior construction projects including decks, driveways, fences, patios & sheds. Remodeling projects requiring permits include additions, garages, finished basements & interior renovations. Permits are also required for any pool capable of holding 24” or more of water as well as hot tubs or spas.

- Allow yourself enough time by turning in your permit applications at least 1 week in advance. Processing time is usually 3-5 working days.
- As the property owner, it is your responsibility to ensure all permits have been obtained prior to beginning any work.
- Permit cards must be on site at all times. Request a copy from your contractor prior to allowing work to begin.
- Always check references/reviews for contractors. The Better Business Bureau (BBB.org) is an excellent resource.
- Check with the Building Department to see if your contractor is current with their registration, insurance & bond.
- Never pay a contractor in full until all final inspections have been completed & approved by our City inspectors.
- Always contact J.U.L.I.E. before you dig, it's a free service & is required by law.

POOL SAFETY

- ✓ Follow all local building and electrical codes related to backyard swimming pools, spas and hot tubs.
- ✓ Always apply for a building permit prior to having a swimming pool, hot tub or spa installed.
- ✓ Secure your pool with appropriate barriers. Completely surround your pool with a minimum 4 foot high fence or barrier with a self-closing, self-latching gate swinging away from the pool. Install alarms on any doors leading to the pool.
- ✓ Place a safety cover on the pool or hot tub when not in use and remove any ladders or steps used for access.
- ✓ Consider installing a pool alarm that goes off if anyone enters the pool.
- ✓ Establish and enforce rules and safe behaviors, such as "No Diving, Stay away from drain covers, Swim with a buddy & No Running"
- ✓ Ensure everyone in the home knows how to swim well by enrolling them in an age-appropriate water orientation and learn-to-swim course (check with your local park district for classes)
- ✓ Keep your pool or hot tub water clean and clear. Maintain proper chemical levels, circulation & filtration. Regularly test and adjust chemicals to minimize health risks.
- ✓ Ensure everyone in the home knows how to respond to aquatic emergencies. Have appropriate safety equipment easily accessible.
- ✓ Enroll all members of the household in a water safety, first aid & CPR course (check with your local Fire Department for information)
- ✓ Keep children under active supervision at all times. Stay within arm's reach of young children. Designate a responsible person to watch the water when people are in the pool – never allow anyone to swim alone.
- ✓ Have young or inexperienced swimmers wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved life jacket.
- ✓ The American Red Cross and National Swimming Pool Foundation have partnered to create an online Home Pool Essentials course that describes the steps home pool owners can take to prevent tragedy and keep a well maintained pool or hot tub. This course is available at www.homepool essentials.org



Source of Drinking Water
The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pickup substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.
Contaminants that may be present in source water include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife. - Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming. - Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm water runoff, and residential uses. - Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff, and septic systems. - Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally-occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at (800) 426-4791.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. FDA regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water which must provide the same protection for public health.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population.

Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. EPA/CDC guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. We cannot control the variety of materials used in plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. Source Water Assessment

We want our valued customers to be informed about their water quality. If you would like to learn more, please feel welcome to attend any of our regularly scheduled meetings. The source water assessment for our supply has been completed by the Illinois EPA. If you would like a copy of this information, please stop by City Hall or call our water operator at 815-838-0549 ext 2307. The Illinois EPA does not consider the city's source water susceptible to contamination. This determination is based on a number of criteria including: monitoring conducted at the wells; monitoring conducted at the entry point to the distribution system; and the available hydrogeologic data on the wells. In anticipation of the U.S. EPA's proposed Ground Water Rule, the Illinois EPA has determined that the water supply is not vulnerable to viral contamination. This determination is based upon the completed evaluation of the following criteria during the Vulnerability Waiver Process: the community's wells are properly constructed with sound integrity and proper site conditions; a hydrogeologic barrier exists that should prevent pathogen movement; all potential routes and sanitary defects have been mitigated such that the source water is adequately protected; monitoring data did not indicate a history of disease outbreak; and a sanitary survey of the water supply did not indicate a viral contamination threat. Because the community's wells are constructed in a confined aquifer, which should minimize the movement of pathogens into the wells, well hydraulics were not considered to be a significant factor in the vulnerability determination. Hence, well hydraulics were not evaluated for this groundwater supply.
