Trash talkin'... or what I learned about the placement of Garbage/Recycle Containers and Refuse on my summer vacation.

Surprisingly, a lot of inquiries that code enforcement receives during the year is regarding the proper placement of garbage containers on residential properties. So much so that we thought we would try to clarify some rules and regulations on garbage containers per **Ordinance 09-062, Section 52.07 – Garbage, Refuse and Waste Collection.**

Where can I place my garbage and recycling containers on collection day?

Section 52.07 (L) states that owners, occupants, or tenants of single-family or two-family dwelling units shall be required to place containers and refuse at the curb line or on the shoulder of a street or alley directly accessible by truck, sufficiently in advance of the arrival of the truck.

Containers and refuse shall not be set out for collection prior to 3:00 pm the night before collection day.

Placement of any garbage, recycling container, waste or refuse in the street or public right-of-way is strictly prohibited per Section 52.07 (E) – No garbage can, bag, or other container for garbage shall be stored on any road or sidewalk, except when it is placed on a public parkway for garbage pick up. The garbage can, bag, or container must be placed on the public parkway that directly abuts the owner or occupant's property. The public right-of-way is defined as the area between private property and/or the public sidewalk and the improved street or road.

Essentially, placement of any items in the roadway obstructs its use. Keeping our streets clear is key to reducing accidents and promoting the safe use of our roadways for the public, emergency personnel and maintenance operations.

How do I dispose of brush and tree limbs?

Section 52.07 (B) shows that these items shall be bound in bundles not to exceed four (4) feet in length and that no single piece within a bundle shall exceed three inches in diameter. Each bundle shall not exceed 60 pounds in weight. These items are to be placed out for collection according to *Section 52.07 (L)*.

Where on my property can I store my garbage and recycle containers when they are not placed behind the curb on collection day?

Per Section 52.07 (R)(1) - For single-family and two-family dwellings, every effort shall be made to screen refuse and recycling containers from public view to the greatest extent possible, using the following requirements:

- (a) No rubbish, garbage or container shall be located in a front yard, and they shall be stored completely out of public view (e.g., behind a fence or within a garage or enclosure), except as permitted otherwise in this chapter for garbage pick-up.
- (b) If compliance with division (a) above is not possible, containers should be stored adjacent to the side of the house or garage, and shall not be located within a front yard, except as permitted otherwise in this chapter for garbage pick-up. Containers shall not be stored within a corner side yard unless fully screened.
- (c) No container shall be placed so as to be unsightly, or so as to constitute a nuisance to adjacent property or the occupants thereof. The containers are to be placed an adequate distance from adjoining properties to prevent health-related impacts (odors, flies and the like) to those properties.
